COURSE DESCRIPTION

Grant writing is a comprehensive approach to securing funding for charitable causes. The process can be simple and practical, yet precise language can make the difference between an award and a decline. The Federal Grant Writing **Cohort** is designed to support a group of emerging and active grant writers on how to prepare for their first grant or finetune writing skills for winning proposals.

Funding Title: FY 2020 EDA Public Works and Economic Adjustment Assistance Programs including CARES Act Funding (PWEAA2020)(11.300) Through the Public Works program, EDA provides catalytic investments to help distressed communities build, design, or engineer critical infrastructure and facilities that will help implement regional development strategies and advance bottom-up economic development goals to promote regional prosperity. The Public Works program provides resources to meet the construction and/or infrastructure design needs of communities to enable them to become more economically competitive. Prior examples of investments EDA has supported through the Public Works program include projects supporting water and sewer system improvements, industrial parks, high-tech shipping and logistics facilities, workforce training facilities, business incubators and accelerators, brownfield redevelopment, technology-based facilities, wet labs, multi-tenant manufacturing facilities, science and research parks, and telecommunications infrastructure and development facilities.

Average Gift - Approximately \$1.4 million and investments generally range from \$600,000 to \$3,000,000 (awards 80 - 150 projects a year). Award Ceiling: \$100K-\$30M | Due: Rolling

- Identify and engage community partners and external stakeholders for collaboration for grants
- Assess organizational capability to structure grant proposal by developing strategies, aligning internal resources, and implementing the project plan in accordance to grant guidelines
